





# US-1/NORTH DIXIE HIGHWAY LANE REPURPOSING STUDY From Quadrille Boulevard to 25th Street

## About the Study

The City of West Palm Beach has partnered with the Palm Beach Transportation Planning Agency (TPA) to conduct the US-1/North Dixie Highway Lane Repurposing Study. This study is one step of a multi-step process, required by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), that aims to advance the communitydesired recommendations identified in the TPA's US-1 Multimodal Corridor Study.

In 2018, the community shared with the US-1 Multimodal Corridor Study team that they would like a differently designed street – one that feels safer and more comfortable to walk and bike along. This feedback resulted in a design recommendation of converting the existing 4-lane roadway to a street with one vehicle lane in each direction, safe bike facilities, increased separation from traffic for pedestrians, and a center-turn-lane. The proposed lane configuration strives to increase safety, meet the vision of local stakeholders to better match the land use and character of the community, create a more comfortable experience for all roadway users and support the City's objective to increase mobility for all.

The US-1/North Dixie Highway Lane Repurposing Study team will follow the FDOT Lane Repurposing (LR) process to further evaluate different options for how to best use the street space. The City, working with the community, would like to explore beautiful landscaping, separated bicycle facilities, enhanced sidewalks, safe pedestrian crossings, and more!
