



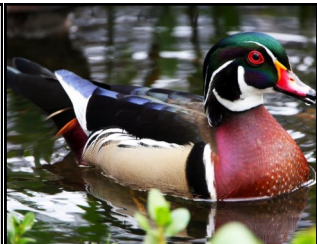
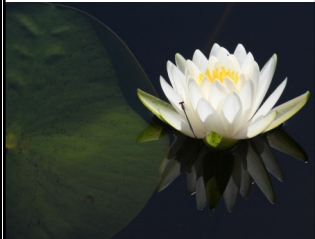
CAN YOU FIND THESE EVERGLADES ANIMALS AND PLANTS ON YOUR COLORING PAGE?

Raccoon
 Its name comes from a Native American word meaning "scrubs and scratches with its hands".



Roseate Spoonbill
 This bird feeds by swishing its spoon-shaped bill through shallow water to catch crustaceans.

Fragrant Water Lily
 These pretty floating flowers open their petals each morning and close them each evening.



Wood Duck
 Unlike most ducks, wood ducks have claws on their webbed feet to help them land in trees.

Sawgrass
 There's a reason this plant is called sawgrass— each stalk has sharp saw-toothed edges.
