Try these free wildlife identification apps



SEEK



Seek is an app created by **iNaturalist**, a joint initiative of the California Academy of Sciences and the National Geographic Society, and it allows users to upload their own photos of any species of plant or animal in order to identify them. Play with the app and identify several to get a series of achievable badges.

AUDUBON



Audubon allows users to report and compare bird sightings. Through an interactive ID tool, users are asked a series of questions about observable bird characteristics such as color, size, tail shape, etc., to lead to identification. For more experienced birders, Merlin Bird ID is also a recommended app.

eBird



Created by the **Cornell Lab of Ornithology**, eBird is a citizen science app where users report their findings to help scientists track bird populations, ranges, and migration.
